The Richland County Soil & Water Conservation District is committed to providing technical assistance to landowners in Richland County as they install and implement programs offered by the Illinois Department of Agriculture. The SWCD is the primary contact, as well as, the delivery source for these programs. Some of the programs offered by the Illinois Department of Agriculture include the Conservation Practices Program, Streambank Stabilization Program, Water Well Sealing initiative, T by 2000 Transect and the Nutrient Management Program. Over the last 5 yrs., the Richland County SWCD has utilized over \$250,000 for construction and implementation of several of these types of projects. In addition to working independently to promote sound conservation practices, the Richland Co. SWCD has a very strong working relationship with the Natural Resources Conservation Service, and assists them in promoting Federal conservation programs.
