# LEGISLATOR OF THE YEAR

# U.S. Congressman Rodney Davis

On January 3, 2013, Rodney was sworn-in as the congressman for the 13th District of Illinois, a 14-county district covering both urban and rural areas of Central and Southwestern Illinois. As a Member of the 113th Congress, Rodney serves on the House Committees on Agriculture and Transportation & Infrastructure.

Since the age of seven, Rodney has lived in Taylorville, where he attended public school. He continued his education in central Illinois and graduated with honors from Millikin University in Decatur.



For 16 years, Rodney served as Projects Director for Congressman John Shimkus. In that position, Rodney became intimately familiar with the role that the federal government plays in our communities, where it can help, and where it can hurt. He was instrumental in helping Illinois citizens and communities cut through government red tape and worked daily to provide support and relief to a wide array of important local projects.

Rodney resides in Taylorville with his wife, Shannon, and their three children, Toryn, Clark and Griffin.

The Davis family attends St. Mary's Church, where Rodney once served on the Finance Committee and as Volunteer Athletic Director. His other civic activities have included serving as fundraising drive chairman for the Christian County United Way, cochairing a multimillion dollar YMCA capital fund drive, and serving on Christian County Senior Center Board of Directors. In his free time, Rodney coaches Taylorville Junior Football and his sons' Little League team.

Jerry has also been very active at the local level as a member of the Henry County Farm Bureau and he recently retired as Lieutenant of the Geneseo Volunteer Fire Department after 30 years of service.

# Sally Ferguson, Rock Island AC

Sally Ferguson has worked as Administrative Coordinator for Rock Island County SWCD since 2012. Prior to that, she worked as a Program Technician for Farm Service Agency. Sally studied Geography, Economics, and Secondary Education at the University of Iowa. Her geography studies prompted an interest in conservation, particularly agricultural conservation. She and her husband, Cole, have 2 raised vegetable garden beds and a strawberry patch. Sally took a high school course in Accounting; the practice books were meticulously recorded on paper. Thankfully, the manual method also etched the basic principles of accounting into memory. # Jordan Seger

Jordan Seger is the Director of the Division of Soil Conservation within the Indiana State Department of Agriculture (ISDA) and oversees field technicians who work directly with private landowners to plan, survey, design, and construct conservation best management practices which provide both economic and environmental benefits. ISDA staff also collaborate directly with the Indiana agricultural industry to seek out opportunities to incorporate the adoption of innovative conservation methods into regular agricultural practice with the goal of building soil health, environmental benefits, and production efficiencies. Seger grew up in and became heavily involved with the poultry industry, has worked for the National Park Service in Maine and Alaska where he conducted air and water quality monitoring, fish and wildlife permitting, and salmon fisheries research. Prior to his current position Seger worked in northwest Indiana as an ISDA field technician.

The Indiana State Department of Agriculture is supporting growth in Indiana agriculture by serving as an advocate and partner as the local, state, federal and global levels; benefiting economic viability in the food, feed, fuel and fiber sectors; driving the advancement of agronomic technologies and promoting sound stewardship of the Indiana landscape.

Don has been an employee of SCS/NRCS for 31 years, the last 27 as District Conservationist in Parke and Vermillion County Indiana. Don is married to Sharon and the father of three adult children. Don enjoys woodworking, collecting Yearbook of Agriculture books, antiquing, going to flea markets, and reading about the Civil War.

Don is a member of the Indiana NRCS Soil Health Team and serves as Soil Health Team Leader for the Southwest Area Soil Health Team. Members of the Indiana SH Team attend various conferences and training such as the National Notill Conference and have visited on the farms of National Soil Health Leaders including Gabe Brown and Dave Brandt to see up close how they have improved the Soil Health of their farm.

Members of the Indiana Soil Health Team work with local Soil and Water Conservation Districts, NRCS employees, and other members of the Indiana Conservation Partnership to promote Soil Health through the use of Conservation Cropping systems including Never Till no-till systems, cover crops, nutrient management and conservation buffers. They are available to speak at field days, notill and cover crop conferences, and to work one on one with farmers and other employees.

# Jennifer Boyle Warner

Jennifer Boyle Warner has served as the Executive Director for the Indiana Association of Soil and Water Conservation Districts (IASWCD) for the past eight years. The IASWCD is the member (non-profit) organization for the 92 local soil and water conservation districts in Indiana. The IASWCD works on legislative issues, communication, training, and capacity building on behalf of the local soil and water conservation districts. Before joining IASWCD, Jennifer worked in Washington DC as a lobbyist and back in Indiana for a local soil and water conservation district and for a state agency as a watershed specialist. Outside of conservation work, Jennifer volunteers for the Indiana Canine Assistant Network, helping train service dogs for people with disabilities. She lives in a rural setting outside of Indianapolis with her husband, two dogs, large garden, and a few chickens!

#### Richard Lyons

Dick Lyons is a cash grain farmer of 42 years in the panhandle of Montgomery County, IL. His family owned farm is now in its 4<sup>th</sup> generation going back to an 1865 Irish immigrant. Continuous no-till has been practiced since 1988 and consists of two rotations, corn-soybeans and corn, soybean and wheat/double crop soybeans. Individual field topography and potential soil erosion determines the crop rotation to be used. Each field is nutrient managed each year based on the previous year's crop removal. All streams and drainage ditches are protected by NRCS CRP filter strips. All fields are tile drained with approximately 60% drained by clay tile installed by his great-grandfather with the remaining 40% consisting of plastic tile installed within the last 10 years. Cover crops have been grown for one year on the farm


