Our MAGIC welcoming celebration will highlight the Illinois Leopold Conservation Award and its 2024 finalists. The Illinois Leopold Conservation Award is an award program that recognizes private landowners in Illinois for their voluntary conservation efforts. The award is named after Aldo Leopold, a well-known conservationist who wrote about land ethics in his 1949 book, A Sand County Almanac. The award recognizes landowners who:

- Demonstrate how to improve land health while still producing food and fiber
- Inspire others with their dedication to environmental improvement
- Manage soil health, water quality, and wildlife habitat on their working land
