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#### **PURPOSE:**

The object of this award is to provide recognition to an outstanding conservation farm family in each Illinois Soil and Water Conservation District that exemplifies <u>Total Resource Management.</u>

The AISWCD Awards Committee will select a Governor's Award winner. Selection will be completed prior to and announced at the AISWCD Annual Meeting/BLWR Summer Conference.

#### **ELIGIBILITY:**

- Open to all landowners and/or operators who are soil and water conservation district cooperators.
- Previous LUC winners will be eligible to reapply in the fourth year following their selection as a winner.
- Former Governor's Award winners are permanently ineligible.
- Only districts in good standing with AISWCD are eligible to compete at the state level competition.
- Entry includes information on all land operated by the owner-operator or the tenant operator.
- Only complete entries will be accepted.

#### ORDER OF ENTRY:

Entries should be typed and sent to Ashley.Curran@aiswcd.org by June 7, 2024. Unusual circumstances will be scored at the discretion of the judges with all decisions final.

- **Section 5:** Typed and signed Soil & Water Conservation District letter of support, not to exceed 2 pages, 12-point font explaining how nominee(s) has contributed to your local conservation efforts and overview of nominee's general farm husbandry.
- **Section 6:** Approximately 8-10 color photos showing family, homestead, conservation practices, etc. with narratives displayed in binder. Photos submitted must be jpg, bmp or tiff format on USB drive along with narration in a Microsoft Word document. Photos placed in PowerPoint or Word document will be accepted if pictures can be cut/pasted into another document.



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Please note: The more information provided in the narratives provides AISWCD more information for inclusion in the awards presentation ceremony.

#### **JUDGING | GUIDELINES FOR DISTRICTS**

Each SWCD should submit their Conservation Farm Family from the entries received at the local level. Only entries completed on the current entry form will be accepted. Entry must include items listed in "Order of Entry" found on page 1 and 2. Districts may announce their Conservation Farm Family after local selection.

#### AWARD PACKAGE:

Each of the winners will be honored at a hospitality hour and awards banquet during the AISWCD Annual Meeting. During the conference each winner (only one family per entry) will receive the following:

- One (1) room for lodging Monday night
- Four (4) complimentary award banquet tickets
- A plaque of recognition
- It will be the responsibility of the SWCD to pay for additional plaques if nominee consists of more than one person/family.
- The overall winner will receive the "Governor's Award" during the awards banquet.
- Recognition at the Illinois State Fair as part of Ag Day festivities.
